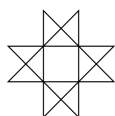
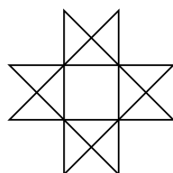

PROGRAM AND CAMP LIFE

Estonian traditions are diverse and offer all of us exciting discoveries. Estonians are rural people who have celebrated holidays both in the middle of the family and with the community - played, sang, danced and dealt with their own mental and physical development - just like us scouts.

During the camp, participants can challenge themselves in a number of areas that require skills, punctuality, determination and resilience. In total, there are six areas of activity.

- In the field of Sports, the topics are archery, golf, skiing, as well as ten other sports of different difficulty and profile.
- On the Day of Adventure there is a choice between several tracks of different difficulty levels, where you must show knowledge or skills in matters related to the camp theme.
- On the Dexterity Day you can try to go through different adventure trails and overcome lower and higher obstacles and ladders.
- Interesting water-related activities are planned for Water Day. A river flows through the campsite, which definitely offers activities for all tastes and ages.
- Folk and Scouting Day is a separate day for developing different scouting skills. These can be building a hut with handy tools, lighting a fire, craft skills, as well as the practical use of knots for scouting.
- One very special day is also dedicated for the development of the Scout Spirit. A guest speaker has been invited to attend. In the evening of the same day, we can also enjoy the campfire evening performances.

The Visitors Day and the Chief scout run will certainly come as well. In addition to various daily activities, the representatives of ancient generations have the opportunity to get acquainted with other activities in the evenings, find contact with foreign guests and sing together at the campfire evenings of the sub-camps.

On the last day, when we all put the camp together again, we will certainly go back to our daily lives much more tired, but richer with many new experiences.

WE LIVE IN SUB-CAMPS AND SPEND THE NIGHT IN TENTS

This time we also pay attention to the scouting traditions of the jamboree! In the year of preparation for the jamboree (October 2020-April 2021), we announce a scout building competition with a different theme every month. In order to participate in the competition, a camp building or a model of a specific month must be built using scout wisdom and 2-4 photos of the building with a description must be sent to the technical manager of the jamboree - Ragnar Luup - ragnar@skaut.ee, by the last day of the month. Natural materials should be used in all buildings. Buildings should be dismantled quickly. The use of the right knots in tying certainly plays a role here. The work of the winners will be carried out in our jamboree and the masters will earn prizes.



During the camp, the condition of the sub-camps is reviewed on a daily basis. The nicest and most developed sub-camp is announced every day and will be given a badge.

Catering

Food during the camp is prepared in a common kettle by specialists in their field.

Kindergarten

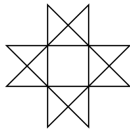

The age of participants is 12-17 years old and ISTs 18+.

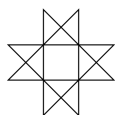
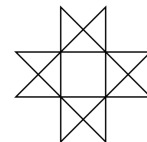

TAGAMETSA HUNTING LODGE AND CAMPING CENTER AND PREVIOUS ESTONIAN JAMBOREES

The Estonian Scout Association's Tagametsa Hunting Lodge and Camp Center is located in Järva County, Türi Parish, in the village of Rassi - in the middle of native forests and near the river Saarjõgi.
